



PENINSULA CLUB CONSTRUCTION BEGINS

Work has begun on the \$1 million Peninsula Club at Point Boston Peninsula following recent Development Approval by the District Council of Lower Eyre Peninsula.

Located on the foreshore with uninterrupted views across the beach and Spencer Gulf, the club has been designed as a gathering place for Point Boston Peninsula residents where they can meet, relax and enjoy the coastal setting.

Point Boston Peninsula is a \$400 million residential project 12 km from Port Lincoln.

Marketing director, Rick Harcourt, says the architectural style of the building reflects the high standard of Australian coastal design and construction which will be consistent throughout the project.

The roof, a translucent high-tensioned membrane, is supported by floor-to-ceiling glass walls, which fold back to let the outside in. A canopy cantilevers beyond the walls. The amenities area, with its own distinctive egg shape, is located at the back.

Harcourt says Point Boston Peninsula is going from strength to strength, notching up more than 160 residential land sales worth around \$25 million in the first 10 months.

"We regard the Peninsula Club as important as building roads, because an enthusiastic and participating community is a thriving community", says Harcourt.

Stage one infrastructure for the project is expected to cost in excess of \$25 million and earthworks are proceeding apace and the first display home on the foreshore is expected to be up within three months.

Designed by South Australian architect John Diekman, the Peninsula Club will be completed in early 2008.
